

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The Redmond Early Learning Center serves 400 kindergarten students in 16 classrooms. The center also serves 60 Pre-Kindergarten students in a Title I PreKindergarten program and in an Inclusive Early Childhood Special Education classroom.

The goal of the Early Learning Center is that it is a hub where children from birth through age six and their families can access the early learning and developmental opportunities and supports that enhance their ability to succeed. Redmond Early Learning Center houses kindergarten from all in-town schools on campus and provides access to pre-kindergarten programs and resources in partnership with other agencies. The center provides equitable access for children and families by offering a “one stop shop,” that is centrally located within our community. The center includes partners to include Early

Childhood Special Education (ECSE), Healthy Beginnings, Family Access Network (FAN), Deschutes County Library, Start Making a Reader Today (SMART), Redmond Area Parks and Recreation District (RAPRD), Family Resource Center (FRC), and OSU Extension.

In the fall of 2017, The center is implementing a Dual language Immersion program in two kindergarten classrooms. Half of each classroom will include Native Spanish and Native English speakers.

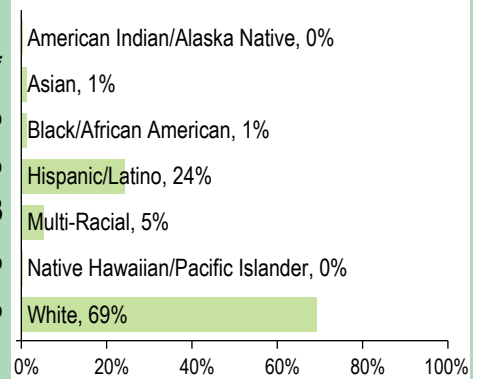

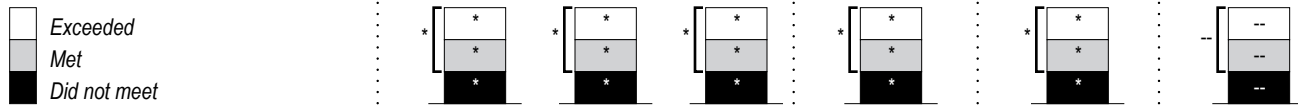
English Language Arts (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)
