September 23, 2020

South Redmond US 97 Urban Renewal District

Director Bailey made a motion to approve the support of the South Redmond US 97 Urban Renewal District. Motion seconded by Director Bennett. Motion carried, 5-0.

Superintendent and Board Updates

Superintendent Cline

- Metrics jumped last week in our county, as well as the statewide positivity rate
- Shifted from 3 weeks of hybrid to 2 weeks of hybrid for K-3, who will be returning Oct 5
- Allowing staff members to bring their K-3 children to school, as well as 4-5 can be at school 5 days a week
- Working on Comprehensive Distance Learning, teachers and administrators are working tirelessly – but we are getting good feedback with the amount of interaction between teachers and students
- Creating activities for students after school

- State Board set a new ruling called “All Students Belong”, OSBA will have a sample policy by the end of this week
- Equity Task Force has received 64 applications, it will be narrowed down to 16 members, the City of Redmond is collaborating, they are forming their own task force, we will be using an advisor through OSU Cascades, first meeting is October 8
- Still down about 200 students from our enrollment projections – we are hoping once we are back to onsite learning we will see some return
- Talking with the City of Redmond about the prospective of drilling wells on several of our campuses for irrigation, it could save significant money over time

Director Goodrich

- Attended OSBA policies webinar and role of the board webinar
- PAC – trying to write letters to the editor and op-ed pieces, also looking for places to put signs
- Looking for reader boards, post card writers, phone banking volunteers

Vice Chair Hartfield

- Started virtual teaching at COCC, it’s challenging

- People are appreciative of the usage of fields
- Online school going okay, had issues with Bendbroadband, it seems to have taken care of itself

Director Bennett

- Younger grades seem to get off track
- Is there gym usage for club sports


Chair Carpenter
